INTERESTING WHITES

PINOT GRIGIO / GRIS

[PEE-noh GREE-jyoh] / [PEE-noh GREE]

Pinot Gris and Pinot Grigio are the same wine. Pinot Grigio is known as light and refreshing with primary fruit flavours of lime, lemon, pear, white nectarine and apple. Depending on where the grapes are grown, Pinot Grigio can take on faint honeyed notes; floral aromas like honeysuckle; and a saline-like minerality. Italian Pinot Grigio is usually totally dry with brilliant acidity with a bitter almond note. The French Pinot Gris is fleshy and more unctuous with faint honey notes. The American version often offers more exaggerated fruit flavors and with less acidity than European counterparts.

FIANO

[fee-AH-noh]

An ancient grape that hails from the Campania region south of Naples in Southern Italy and also grown on the island of Sicily. Fiano is a perfumed and flavourful variety that produces medium bodied wines, with fresh acidity, and flavours of peaches and tropical fruits with hints of hazelnuts, honey, spices and wildflowers.

GARGANEGA

[gar-GAHN-eh-gah]

Garganega is the main variety of Soave, and is widely grown in the Veneto region of North East Italy. It produces wines that are light to medium bodied, displaying flavours of citrus zest, white plum, honeydew, almond, and spice, held together by crisp acidity.

The Verdicchio grape is grown in the hillsides of north-central and western Marche, making light to medium bodied wines, with crisp acidity, and flavours of citrus lemon, flowers, dried herbs and almonds.

[SHEN-inn-BLAHN(k)]

Chenin Blanc has a wide range of flavors. Part of the reason for this has a lot to do with the winemaking style. Our Chenin Blanc is medium bodied, fresh, with flavors of lemons, pears, and stone fruits and has a slightly creamy and nutty texture.

Sauvignon Blanc is a white wine that owes much of its popularity to winemakers in Bordeaux and the Loire Valley in France. It makes light to medium bodied, crisp to fresh acidity, mouthwatering wines. The primary fruit flavors of Sauvignon Blanc are lime, green apple, passion fruit and white peach, combined with other herbaceous flavors like bell pepper, jalapeño, gooseberry and cut grass.

CHARDONNAY

[shar-duh-NAY]

The world's most planted white grape and also the world's most popular is said to be Chardonnay. Light Unoaked Chardonnays, are crisp, and offer a fruitier profile of yellow apples, fresh pineapples and mangos to a leaner, more floral profile of white flowers, green apples, pears and citrus peels. Oaked Chardonnays are bold, full-bodied, fresh in acidity, and have a richer profile of lush tropical fruits, grilled pineapples, butterscotch and vanilla to a lighter profile of poached pears, lemon curds, baked apples and a textural chalky minerality. PINOT NOIR

[PEE-noh-NWAHR]

While Pinot Noir grows in countless other countries, it reaches its highest peaks of expression in the cool climates and stony soils found in the Burgundy region of France. It produces a heavily perfumed wine with scents of cherries, raspberries and strawberries when ripe, and herbs, earth, spice. It is a light to medium bodied wine, with high acidity that can age well.

MERLOT & BLENDS

[mer-LOH]

Grown around the world, Merlot is the most popular and widely planted wine grape varietal in France, reaching its truest expression in Bordeaux wine. Cool climate Merlot wines offers flavours of fresh cherries, plums, vanilla and are more structured with a higher presence of tannins and earthy flavors like tobacco and tar. Warm climate Merlot wines gives more fruit-forward flavours like cooked cherries, prunes, and vanilla with tannins less prevalent. Some producers use judicious oak-treatment to give their Merlot wine more structure.

SYRAH / SHIRAZ

[see-RAH] / [shih-RAHZ]

Syrah is one of world's most popular and widely planted red wine grape varieties. Syrah grows best in the steep, rocky hillsides found in the Northern Rhone Valley of France. Old World Syrahs from Italy and France tend to have more acidity and earthy-herbaceous aromas. New World-styled Syrah wines from Australia and the United States usually have more fruit-driven characteristics with lots of spice. Syrah is responsible for some of the darkest full-bodied red wines in the world. It has dark fruit flavors from sweet blueberry to savory black olive and a spicy peppery note in the aftertaste.

GRENACHE & BLENDS

[gren-AHSH]

Grenache, is one of the most widely planted red grapes in the world; it's also one of the key ingredients in some of the world's most famous wines, one of them being the famous French Rhone blend Châteauneuf-du-Pape. Grenache is medium to full bodied and is known for its berry flavors of bright strawberries and raspberries, notes of white pepper and also has that distinct candied fruit roll-up and cinnamon flavour. Delicious!

CABERNET SAUVIGNON & BLENDS

[ka-ber-NAY-soh-vee-NYAWN]

Cabernet Sauvignon is grown in a wide range of climates and regions throughout the world and it has varied flavors. It is a full-bodied wine with dark fruit flavours and savory tastes from black pepper to bell pepper. Cabernet Sauvignon from Bordeaux tastes more like the herbal/floral flavors of graphite, violets and tobacco than fruit. Hints of black cherries and licorice along with the earthiness are often found. Expect flavors of Black Cherries, Licorice and Black Pepper all wrapped together with a dash of Vanilla from the New World countries. The wines tend to have a little bit less tannin and acidity but also have more alcohol.

GAMAY

[ga-MAY]

Gamay is a light to medium bodied red wine that grows primarily in the southernmost extent of the Burgundy region called Beaujolais. Gamay wines are loved for their delicate floral aromas, subtle earthy notes, and surprising ability to pair with food.

BARBERA

[bar-BEH-rah]

Native to Piedmont, but now widespread in Italy and internationally. Barbera is a great wine for everyday drinking. They are full and aromatic and have a fleshy texture with ripe fruit flavours, and an acidity that gives them a special freshness.

Arguably Italy's greatest red grape variety, responsible in north-west Italy for the great reds of barolo and barbaresco. Nebbiolo is one of the most delightfully aromatic of red grape varieties. Structured by high acidity and high tannin, Nebbiolo's bouquet encompasses violet, smoke and rose-like perfumes with flavours of truffle, fennel, liquorice and, most famously, tar.

INTERESTING REDS

CORVINA

[kOr-vee-na]

It's the most important grape in the blend of all Valpolicella wines and Amarone, giving them structure and aromas. Corvina is a very complex and versatile grape that gives very fresh and pleasant fruity flavours to the Amarone, especially cherries, plums, black currants and herbs and gradually evolving into even more complex flavours such as dried plums, cherry jam amongst others.

SANGIOVESE

[SAN-joh-VAY-zay]

The Sangiovese grape is the most planted red variety in Italy's vineyards. It is a bit of a chameleon as there are many different mutations of the variety all over Italy, which results in very different tasting wines. From the delicate floral strawberry and cherry aromas of Chianti to the intensely dark and tannic wines of Brunello di Montalcino, Sangiovese wine has something for everyone. It is savory. It offers a wide range of tastes from very earthy and rustic—as is the case with many Chianti Classico—to round and fruit-forward. Regardless of where it's grown, it always exhibits cherry flavors with more subtle notes of tomato. Many Super-Tuscan wines also derive largely from Sangiovese.

SAGRANTINO

[sah-grahn-Tee-noh]

This superstar grape of Umbria typically show lots of heady black fruit aromas mainly big cherry and plum fruits, with hints of smoke, almonds and spice. The wines are usually round and fruity with ample but balanced tannins; good length.

INTERESTING REDS

MONTEPULCIANO

[MOHN-teh-pool-CHAH-noh]

Montepulciano is the second most planted red grape in Italy after Sangiovese. This grape produces medium bodied wines that are ripe and smooth, well perfumed and complex, with good structure and distinctive fruitiness. They are black-fruit driven, chocolaty with robust herbal and tobacco-like flavours. These wines age well.

AGLIANICO

[ah-LYAH-nee-koh]

Aglianico makes great rustic, earth-driven wines, which are rich, full-bodied and intense and are found almost exclusively in Southern Italy in the regions of Campania and Basilicata. Aglianico wines are known for strikingly savory flavors of leather, white pepper, black fruits and cured meat that when aged, develop soft dusty aromas of dried figs and sun-tanned leather.

PRIMITIVO

[pree-mee-TEE-voh]

This Southern Italian grape makes rich, ripe, fruit-forward, red wines with abundant weight that tastes of dark fruits like fresh figs, blueberries and baked blackberries. There’s a distinct dried fruit-leather character to it as well.

Cork hasn’t always sealed wine containers. Greeks and Romans used a layer of olive oil. The French used oil-soaked rags to seal wine bottles. It wasn’t until the 1780s that corks came into common use to seal wine bottles. This made bottle aging possible.

INTERESTING REDS

NERO D'AVOLA

[NEH-roh-DAH-voh-lah]

Nero d'Avola also called Calabrese is the most widely planted variety of red grape in Sicily. It's one of Italy's finest indigenous grapes, and is a superb asset to blending thanks to its firm structure and ability to age. Nero d'Avola can be made in two different styles, one is a more fruit-forward, opulent and black-fruit driven that offers up coffee and chocolate flavors from aging in oak barrels. The other is much leaner and more elegant with zippy red cherry fruit flavors, herbal notes and very little or no oak aging.

ZINFANDEL

[ZIN-fan-dell]

The primary flavors of Zinfandel are jam, raspberries, blackberries, black cherries, plums, black pepper and licorice. When you taste Zinfandel it often explodes with candied fruitiness followed by spice and often a tobacco-like smoky finish. It's rich, round and full, but with refreshing acidity; great length.
